


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

This coloring book shows some of the Mint's coin designs honoring important people, places, and events in U.S. history.











2026 SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL DIME

The 2026 dime obverse shows liberty wearing a cap bearing stars and stripes as seen in early American coinage. The reverse features an eagle in flight carrying arrows in its talons.

The quarters obverse features George Washington, the first President of the United States and Commander of the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War.



ZOZS SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL QUARTERS

Thomas Jefferson was the author of the Declaration of Independence and the third President of the United States. The Liberty Bell found on the reverse of the quarter is an iconic symbol of the country's founding and a symbol of the Declaration of Independence.



2026 SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL QUARTERS


James Madison was the fourth President of the United States and known as the Father of the Constitution for his role in drafting and promoting the foundational document.


